**ST. THERESA OF THE CHILD JESUS
PATRONESS OF THE COLLEGE**

St. Theresa of the Child Jesus was born on 2, January, 1873 in the small town of Alencon in France. Her father Louis Martin and mother Zelig were proud of their little Theresa with the golden hair.

As a vibrant teenager of fifteen she left a life of solid middle class comfort for the austerities of the convent and joined the strict order of cloistered Carmelite sisters. Her life became a spiritual masterpiece, because of the perfection with which she performed her ordinary daily tasks. Her earthly life, though hidden and short-lived was glorious before God who loves humble and simple souls. Theresa's physical journey of life ended on 1, October 1896.

On 17 May, 1925, Pope Pious XI declared Blessed Theresa of Child Jesus to be a saint of the Church of God. Today her image is found in the humblest village church and in great Cathedrals.

St. Theresa has shown a simple way to holiness and happiness, namely to trust in God as a Child trusts his father and to please Him by living in simplicity and humility and serving others with genuine love.

ST. THERESA'S COLLEGE FOR WOMEN, ELURU

THE FOUNDATION:

The Sisters of St. Ann is a Congregation dedicated to the cause of Women's education. The Sisterhood was started in Turin (Italy) in 1834 by a noble couple Marquis Carlo and Marchioness Julia of Barolo and consolidated by Sister Enrichetta Dominici. The desire to share God's love with the poor and under privileged children in any part of the world led the sisters to undertake the long and tedious journey to India. Mother Enrichetta, the then Superior General sent six Italian sisters to India. They reached Secunderabad in 1871 and started a school there.

Later, when the parents of Eluru pleaded for a school for girls, the Sisters started St. Theresa's High School in Eluru in 1938. It was the fulfillment of the dream of Mother Clemenza, the then Provincial Superior, that led to the foundation of the College on 5th July 1953.

HISTORY OF THE COLLEGE:

Ch.S.D.St. Theresa's College was founded in 1953 by sisters of St. Ann of Providence, Secunderabad. It offers Intermediate, Degree and Postgraduate courses to the girl students. The college is affiliated to the Andhra University which granted autonomy to the degree section during the year 1987-88. The college was assessed by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) in 1998, 2005 & 2012 and was awarded 'A' Grade with Top Score. The University Grants Commission conferred the award of COLLEGE WITH POTENTIAL FOR EXCELLENCE in the year 2005.

St. Theresa's College is a Catholic Minority Institution, but it is open to all the students as well. In carrying out its aims the college as a minority institution, reserves for itself its inherent and constitutionally recognized rights of Management and Administration. Freedom of conscience and other religious faiths will always be respected in this institution, but public and organized worship other than catholic may not be carried out in the college and hostel premises.

INSTITUTIONAL GOAL: To create personally mature, professionally equipped and service oriented integrated women leaders committed to Excellence and trained on the lines of Gospel Truths to become assets to the community and nation.

OBJECTIVES:

- a. To inculcate in the students the value of the Gospel and those enshrined in the preamble of the Indian constitution such as Love, Justice, Truth, Simplicity, Self-Sacrifice, Service and Esteem for Spiritual values.
- b. To create conducive atmosphere for best education through active involvement of the staff and well Co-ordinated educational programmes for the over-all formation of students.
- c. To develop the intellectual capacity and quest for truth and knowledge in order to assume personal responsibility for their own lives.
- d. To empower every student to extend into society to take up the issues of social concern especially of women/ girls and downtrodden in order to protect their dignity.

PIONEERS OF THE COLLEGE

Mother Clemenza was the dynamic Provincial Superior who was the leader of the sisters after Independence. She started several schools and convents all over India. It was she who took the bold step of starting the first, Private Women's College in Andhra (Eluru). The first correspondent Sister Theresa, Sr.Eufrasina, the architects-Bro. Giani David, Mother Consiglia and Sister Antida are persons of special remembrance.

HISTORICAL LAND MARKS

- 1953 : On 5th July the Sisters of St. Ann of Providence armed with the missionary zeal to cater to women's education under the leadership of Mother Clemenza founded St. Theresa's College for women with eight students.
- 1954 : The College flowers and expands with the introduction of the arts section at the P.U.C. level.
- 1955 : Mrs. D'Souza the first principal & Sister Theresa the first correspondent pave the way to further development by recruiting competent staff members.
- 1956 : Further expansion materialized with the science section introduced at the P.U.C course.
- 1957 : The student strength increases to 65 with the P.U.C. courses being offered in a specially constructed building.
- 1958 : A momentous leap taken by the institution with the launch of degree courses – B.A & B.Sc, the Theresian family now strengthened with 16 staff and 97 students.

- 1959 : The construction of the aesthetically designed college buildings by architect Brother Giani David under swing.
- 1960 : Staff strength increases to 22 and students to 205.
- 1961 : New college building completed successfully and inaugurated with the golden touch of Sri Pattabhi Rama Rao, Minister of Education.
- 1962 : The hostels add a whole new dimension to women's education by giving necessary support and security.
- 1963 : New methodologies like group dynamics and seminars take teaching to new avenues.
- 1964 : A woman of great caliber, Sr. Josephine Xavier appointed as principal; staff council, NCC & Tutor ward system introduced under her stewardship.
- 1965 : Sr. Josephine's golden touch strengthens the college with growing number of staff and students.
- 1969 : P.U.C course is transformed into "Inter mediate" course launched with a student body now having reached 1000.
- 1970 : Exciting avenues for scientific orientation made possible with the inauguration of the new science laboratories.
- 1971 : A centenary gift of the sisterhood's charism in India results in the launch of the P.G Economics course, B.Com., B.Sc. H.Sc, B.A Psychology and BA Social Work.
- 1972 : All courses move on with dynamism and accelerated pace leading the Institution forward.
- 1973 : A new milestone reached with the foundation stone laid for the new campus at Gavaravaram to house B.Sc and Post graduate courses. P.G.Economics I batch secure eight I classes & Gold medal.
- 1975 : Quality conscious efforts to elevate teaching standards with introduction of "Effective Teaching Committee". NSS introduced.
- 1976 : Improved teaching/learning methodologies introduced.
- 1977 : With a strength of 1850 students college reaches a milestone its silver jubilee celebration. F.I.P, COSSIP, NAEP programmes internalized.
- 1979 : The new campus spruced up to house the degree courses.

- 1980 : With a strength of 2000 students the degree courses were carried out successfully under the stewardship of Sr. Josephine which comes to an end this year.
- 1981 : Sr. Winifred, a creative, dynamic and efficient Principal assumes charge. Permanent affiliation of Degree courses to Andhra University made a reality.
- 1982 : Staff upgradation with registration for Ph.D. underway. Staff and student strength increases.
- 1983 : COHSSIP introduced in BA & B.Com streams.
- 1984 : Sr. Vincenza takes over as In-charge Principal. At the intermediate level C.E.C. course is added.
- 1985 : Sr. Winifred resumes charge. Student services attain great momentum with celebration of International year of youth, restructured nutrition & dietetics course introduced in B.Sc.
- 1986 : Telugu Medium B.A. introduced as a boon to vernacular medium students.
- 1987 : Autonomous System brings in a recharge in Educational practices. Semester End exam, Continuous Assessment, Academic Council, Boards of studies are the sweeping changes effected. New degree science block inaugurated by Governor of A.P.
- 1988 : 5 NSS units launched taking community service to great heights. B.Sc computer Science & Horticulture launched.
- 1989 : B.Sc Electronics, BA Office Management, at Degree level, MLT at Intermediate level introduced.
- 1990 : Job oriented courses at intermediate level introduced with CGDM. Student-centered activities such as Mass Literacy Programmes launched.
- 1991 : M.E.S group launched at B.A level. NSS activities achieve great community orientation.
- 1992 : Dr. G. Lalitha 1st Theresian to win state Best Teacher Award from Govt. of A.P. National Integration camp conducted with State Education Minister and Dy. Minister for Social Welfare as visiting luminaries.
- 1993 : Autonomy Review Committee adjudges the college as the best while extending autonomous status. Prathanalaya the prayer hall inaugurated. Dr. Sr. Marietta Pudota assumes charge as Principal and brings in greater innovation with the campus extension programmes.

- 1994 : Dr. Madhavi, faculty of English is the first G.S.E member to visit Canada & USA. She is awarded Paul Harris fellowship.
- 1995 : College receives best NSS units Award under Dr. Marietta Pudota & Dr. Marietta D'Mello achieve Best Organiser award. Theo Mathias award to Dr. V. Rajani. Microbiology Biochem & Nutrition (MBN) introduced in B.Sc.
- 1996 : College receives 'The Best College in W.G. Dist' for "Janma Bhoomi" activities. MA English, BSc Seed Technology launched. Inter collegiate championship in games & sports for Degree & Intermediate sections. Sr. Hedwig annual award for the college.
- 1997 : NAAC accreditation of A***** status takes the college to a high quality zone. 1st College in AP & 8th in the county to undergo this assessment, the college secured 82.5% score. Job memorial award conferred for Innovations in educational programmes (campus extension). MA English discipline reaps rich with 100% I classes & AU Gold Medal.
- 1998 : Inter collegiate championship in sports & games, conferred on degree college. Ms. Pamela selected as GSE member to France.
- 1999 : St. Theresa's Educational Programme for the Under Privileged (STEP-UP) launched. Dr. Sr. Marietta receives State Best Teacher award.
- 2001 : Dr. Sr. Thesia Cherian assumes charge as Principal. Miss Iris Sylvester achieves Theo Mathias Award. T-TIPS launched to promote upgradation of teaching standards. Overall championship trophy for 12th time in games & sports. Autonomous status extended for another 5 years.
- 2002 : Sr. Ernestine appointed as Vicar General, Rome. Great surge in activities and infrastructural development. Inauguration of canteen new building. College bag overall championship at cultural and sports & games meets.
- 2003 : The College celebrates its Golden Jubilee with great fanfare. AUTONOMOUS SYSTEM

The College was granted autonomous status by the Andhra University in 1987. From 2013 the college is affiliated to the Adikavi Nannaya University.

1. The Aim of Autonomy: To make the Degree College a responsible self-governing body, committed to the values symbolized in the College Emblem.

2. Objectives of Autonomy: The following objectives are worked out to achieve the aim.

- i. To reshape the curriculum keeping in view self-generation and self-sustaining factors relevant to today's needs.
- ii. To encourage self-learning
 - a. by offering various modified courses
 - b. by providing opportunities for service
 - c. by providing options in curricular as well as co-curricular activities.
- iii. To promote scientific approach and research interest both in staff and students through project work and other innovations
- iv. To promote a sound value system by offering value education and community service through NSS, Personality Development camp etc.
- v. To create opportunities to "earn while you learn scheme" and grow self-esteem.
- vi. To promote creativity and responsible thought of action for successful implementation of autonomy.
 - a. Autonomy is self-governing.
 - b. Freedom in mature decision making.
 - c. Freedom to be ones best self.

3. Examination and Evaluation system:

- i. Each semester has two periodical tests and an assignment as part of Continuous Assessment (C.A.) and Semester End Exam (S.E.E.)
- ii. C.A. is closely linked with attendance. A student who continues to absent herself scores low percentage of marks in C.A. as she misses tests, assignments and seminars. She is not eligible

to appear for S.E.E. if she gets less than 90% attendance in each semester (including Science Practicals)

- iii. C.A. will not be re-conducted for *absentees*.
- iv. Students should take *Project work* with research orientation in final year.
- v. Original marks list will be issued after each semester.
- vi. The application for revaluation should be submitted to the controller's office, within one week after the issue of marks list, in the prescribed proforma with a fee of Rs. 500/- per paper.
- vii. (*) Asterisk Mark on the consolidated marks list indicates more than one attempt.
- viii. All the eligible candidates should pay the examination fee in full irrespective of the candidate undertaking the examination.
- ix. Calculators are allowed for Math's (I Semester and Paper IV), Statistics and III B.Com Accounts papers only.

4. College Traditions and Rules of Conduct to be followed by faculty and students:

- i. St. Theresa's college is a catholic minority institution. It upholds faith in Jesus Christ and Gospel values. *Propagation of any other faith within the campus by any individual or group is prohibited. The faculty is not permitted to influence any student to follow a particular faith or religion.*
- ii. Each Theresian is expected to uphold the traditions and standards of the College. She should attend this College not merely to gain knowledge but also to develop as a matured, cultured and committed woman of character.

- iii. Academic awards should be a consequence of the process of building up attitudes and values which in turn make her a strong and harmonious person, determined to spread joy and peace everywhere.
- iv. Students are urged to volunteer generously to join the various programmes and associations to promote social awareness and bring light to those in darkness.
- v. Students are anticipated to be neat and modest and uphold the dignity of labour and keep the Campus clean and beautiful.
- vi. Classes begin at 9 a.m. Students should be punctual and participate actively in Daily Assembly, Value education Classes, Associations, Meetings and Games.
- vii. Religious members of the staff should be addressed as ‘Sister’ and the faculty members as Ma’am/Sir as the case may be.
- viii. When the Lecturer enters the classroom, students should rise and remain standing till they greet the lecturer. Students should likewise stand when she leaves the class.
- ix. Students may not loiter in the corridors during class hours even though they may be free at the moment. **Littering is prohibited on campus. They shouldn’t scribble on chairs, desks, walls, windows and black boards.**
- x. Day Scholars shall not be allowed in to the Hostel rooms.

5. College Rules of Discipline for staff and students:

- i. The staff and the students are forbidden to organize or attend any meeting in the college or to collect money without the permission of the Principal.
- ii. No staff or student may enroll herself as a member of any outside organization without the permission of the Principal. Any breach of this rule will be treated seriously.
- iii. The staff and students are not allowed to address any authority in a body. Such combined action is subversive to good order.
- iv. No matter for publication, in newspapers, magazines or journals may be submitted in the name of the college by any staff or student without the permission of the Principal.

- v. The staff and students on the rolls of the college are forbidden to take any active part in party or communal politics or in any agitation directed against the authority or the Government. The Principal may, at her discretion, forbid students or staff to engage prominently in any public movement, which would go against the tradition or reputation of the college.
- vi. If staff or students attend political meetings and conduct themselves in any manner which is forbidden or engage in political agitation in such a way as to interfere with the corporate life and educational work of the college, the Principal of the college may suspend or initiate necessary action against the deterring individual.
- vii. Students reported of malpractice in Examinations will be **severely dealt with and even dismissed.**
- viii. No student who is admitted to college is automatically eligible for university/Board examinations or promotion to the next class. The Principal may at her discretion direct a student either for her repeated poor performance in studies or her irregular attendance or for indulging in strikes and demonstrations to withdraw from the college or the public examinations.
- ix. Admission must be requested for each year into Hostel which will depend on the students conduct and progress in the previous year.
- x. A student after completion of her degree for three consecutive years only is allowed to write the supplementary examination on that syllabus. After three years she will have to comply with whatever syllabus is in existence.
- xi. **Uniform** designed by the college is compulsory for all the Intermediate, UG and PG students.
- xii. Students are **not permitted** to use **Mobile** phones on Campus. **ONLY THOSE WHO SATISFY ALL THE PRESCRIBED RULES OF CAMPUS DISCIPLINE SHALL BE CONSIDERED FOR YEAR END COLLEGE AWARDS, PROFICIENCY PRIZES AND OTHER PRIZES.**

6. Rules of Attendance

- i. **The College insists on 90% attendance for all the students in each semester. Those who fall short of 90% will have to pay the condonation fee as prescribed by the management. Those who do not have 75% attendance will not be eligible for Semester-End Examinations/Board Exams.**
- ii. From 2012-13, five marks per paper, per semester are being allotted for regularity in attending classes in respective subjects.
- iii. Attendance shall be taken at the beginning of every period.
- iv. A student who is absent without leave for two periods will lose half day's attendance. If absent for more than two periods, will lose whole day's attendance.
- v. **Attendance is compulsory on the re-opening and closing days.**
- vi. The students can obtain monthly attendance status from the ward tutors attendance counter on the first Thursday of every month.
- vii. Names of the students falling short of attendance would be displayed on the notice board on the last working day of every month.
- viii. Attendance at Physical Training (Games) is compulsory for all students.
- ix. No student may absent herself from any class without permission. Permission to leave for a portion of class may be obtained from the Lecturer in-charge. Leave for several periods must be obtained from the Principal.
- x. Leave will not be granted during working hours for the purpose of meeting parents, guardians, relatives or friends.
- xi. Application for leave must be made in writing on the prescribed form before the first day of absence and submitted to the vice-principal.
- xii. Leave applications must be countersigned by the tutor and parent/guardian in the case of day scholars and the warden in the case of hostellers.

- xiii. Students being involved in co & extra-curricular activities thus missing regular classes should get prior written permission from the principal by submitting a letter of request counter signed by the concerned officer (NSS NCC/Sports/Cultural) and report to the principal on completion of the programme. On duty attendance will be given only to such students.

7. Government and University Rules for Students

The Syndicate in exercise of power conferred upon it under Act and the code, has therefore been pleased to make the following standing orders in regard to the students of the University and affiliated colleges.

- i. The Principal or any other constituted college or Hostel Authority shall have complete power for the maintenance of discipline of students of the college.
- ii. The Principal may frame and issue disciplinary rules time to time, of a permanent or temporary character regulating the conduct within the college or hostel premises of graduate and undergraduate students on the rolls if such rules seem necessary to maintain the credit, usefulness, and reputation of the college or hostel.
- iii. The Principal or any other constituted college or Hostel Authority shall have full power to inflict punishments like fines, suspension or expulsion for loss of attendance, loss of term certificates or any other act of indiscipline against the rules.
- iv. The Principal shall place herself in communication if necessary with the parents or guardians of those students who are very backward and do not show any improvement or whose attendance is very irregular and conduct unsatisfactory. The names of students found incorrigible even after warnings may be removed from the rolls, after intimation to parents or guardians. The orders of the Principal in this matter shall be final.
- v. **Ragging in any form is totally banned and any case reported will be severely dealt with.**

8. College Rules regarding issue of Certificates and Withdrawal

- i. Students desiring a Transfer Certificate should apply for it in the prescribed form with the counter signature of the parent.
- ii. Students admitted into Intermediate will not get back their X Class T.C. once it is submitted. Instead they will be issued the Intermediate T.C. only.
- iii. Those studying in Degree Class will not get back the Intermediate Class T.C. once it is submitted, but will be issued the Degree T.C. only.
- iv. Any request for marks sheet such as X Class, Intermediate or Degree when required for a few hours by the candidate should be made in writing and signed by the principal.
- v. A student can leave the Institution only after an application is made to the principal signed by her parent or guardian for the issue of her Transfer Certificate.
- vi. Transfer Certificate shall not be granted until the student has paid all outstanding dues or arrears to the college and returned all library books.
- vii. Students are advised to retain true copies of all certificates submitted to the office.

9. Admission Rules and Procedure for all Courses:

- i. Application for admission into college should reach the principal within the prescribed date.
- ii. Application forms will be issued from the college office.
- iii. Duly filled in Applications should be accompanied by:
 - a. True Copies of certificates or other evidence of having passed the prescribed qualifying examinations.
 - b. A certified copy of the marks statement obtained by the applicant at the qualifying examination.
 - c. An Extract of the date of birth as entered in the S.S.C. register of college records attested by the principal of a recognized College or by a Gazetted Officer.

- iv. **Admission:** The selected candidates will be intimated through phone or mail. Since the number of seats in each group is fixed by the university, the students who join the first year should complete their full course in this college. **Those who apply for T.C. without completing should pay the fees for the full course.**
- v. On the Day of admission they should submit:
 - a. Original Transfer Certificate from their previous Institution.
 - b. Caste Certificate for scholarship - holders.
 - c. Original document of the Certificates which has been submitted with application form.
 - d. Three copies of recent passport size photographs.
 - e. Certificates of physical fitness from a Regd. Medical practitioner.
 - f. A Statement that they will not apply for other courses or jobs.

10. Fee Concession & Scholarships

The following fee concessions are available for the students of the college.

- i. The Residential and Non-residential scholarships for Backward classes given by Social Welfare department are available to students whose parents annual income does not exceed Rs.2,00,000/- per year.
- ii. Government of India scholarships to Scheduled Caste converted Christians, Scheduled Tribes and other Backward Classes are also available to students with parents income limit of Rs.2,00,000/- per year.
- iii. Scholarships to economically poor persons are also available to students whose parents annual income does not exceed Rs. 2,00,000/-

iv. Meritorious students and others who fall under the prescribed category may avail the various scholarships mentioned below. Students are advised to secure the application forms and apply in time.

- a. Merit Scholarship awarded by Commissioner of Collegiate Education, A.P., Hyderabad.
- b. Govt. of India National Scholarships scheme of award merit scholarships post matriculation studies.
- c. Govt. of India Scheme for the award Post matric Scholarships for study in Hindi to the students belonging to Non-Hindi speaking states.
- d. Economically Backward classes (EBC) scholarships.
- e. Scholarship for **Physically Challenged & Minority**.

11. Fee Regulations

- i. Every student shall pay the whole fee for each year if her name is on the rolls of the institution.
- ii. Fees will be collected once at the beginning of the academic year. The fee should be remitted in the Andhra Bank, St. Theresa's College Branch.
- iii. Fees once paid cannot be refunded.
- iv. A student who wishes to discontinue on any ground will have to pay the full course fee in order to obtain T.C.

12. General Facilities and Services

i. Students Union and Associations: The Students Union and allied Associations play an active role in the life of the college. There are separate Unions for Post-Graduate, Under Graduates and Intermediate Students. The Office Bearers for the Union and Associations are elected annually by representative vote. Through the organization of various functions, competitions and celebrations of festivals and events the students gain experience in leadership and team spirit and make the campus come alive.

ii. N.S.S./N.C.C./Rotaract/AICUF/Women's Cell/Sports and Games offer a challenge to students to develop their personalities and offer their services to poor and needy of the society.

iii. Tutor Ward System: The Tutor-ward system is arranged to assist the students in their personality development. Once a week the tutor meets her ward students and carries out the following tasks.

- a. Helps them to fill-up the bio-data form for the office and in their hand-books.
- b. Conveys the students all the information in the hand-book.
- c. Exhorts the students on the traditions rules and regulations of the college as given in the hand-book.
- d. Checks the attendance of the Ward Students every month, warns those who are regularly absent, meets their parents and takes necessary action. In case of continuous absentees the Ward Tutor should bring the matter to the notice of the Principal.
- e. Listens to the grievances of the students and offers them the best possible help.
- f. Encourages the ward students to participate in competitions, associations and other extra-curricular activities.
- g. Plans an outing once a year with the ward students.

iv. Campus Ministry: To offer facilities for the moral and spiritual development of the students, value education classes are held. Orientation Courses for freshers, Family Life Education seminars for final year students are held. A retreat for Catholics and prayer service on important occasions and festivals are arranged. Prardhanalaya, situated at the centre of the campus, remains open to all students and staff for 12 hours of the day to spend time in quite atmosphere under Divine presence.

- v. **Canteen and Stationery:** Canteen and stationary facilities are available to meet the immediate requirements of staff and students.
- vi. **Hostel:** Integral parts of the College are the hostels in the two campuses. Facilities are available for about 1000 students who are under the supervision of wardens and assistant wardens. The spirit of oneness is fostered as students come from different social, economic and religious backgrounds. The fortnightly, common recreation and celebration of Hostel Day and other major festivals offer the students an opportunity to discover and develop their talents.
- vii. **Counseling and career guidance:** A five member team consisting of a doctor, a psychologist and three experienced staff members form the counseling cell. Students have access to them during the working days from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m.
- viii. **College Office:** The College Office functions in each Campus and the office staff are available to help the students regarding Fees, Scholarships, Examinations etc. The office is opened for the benefit of the students from 8.30 a.m. to 5.00 p.m.
- ix. **A Gym and a Health Care centre** are available on the campus for the wellbeing of both staff & students.
- x. **Library:** St. Theresa's College Library is housed in three different blocks as follows.
 - a. P.G. Library is located on the 1st floor of the P.G. Extension Block in degree campus.
 - b. Degree Library is situated on the first floor of the P.G. Block.
 - c. Intermediate Library is situated on the first floor of the left wing of the old college building.
 - d. Acquisitions: The Library has very good collection of Books numbering 92,211 volumes consisting of Reference Books, Literary works, Annuals,

Encyclopedias, Competition books, Generalia and Back Volumes of periodicals. The Library has a subscription to 122 National Journals, 36 International Journals. The latest addition of 3,000 e-journals and 75,000 e-books through INFLIBNET, Ahmedabad, 27 e-journals through IEEE computer society digital library, U.S.A. and 1,33,33,438 e-journals, ebooks, CD-ROMs from DELNET have provided a facelift to the already existing vast collection of 510 CD ROM database, 10 Daily Papers (5 English + 5 Telugu). Technical up gradation of the library includes campus wide local area networking (LAN), installation of Online Public Access System, broad band internet facility on campus, close circuit camera and bar code technology. The library provides current awareness service, internet facility, reprographic service, token system for students property counter. **The College links up with e-journal consortium through INFLIBNET, IEEE & DELNET. Book and journals are available through Web Consortium.**

- e. **Book Bank:** The Library maintains a Book Bank with a sizeable number of books for economically backward students who will be allowed to borrow 2 extra books for a period of 3 months or a year as may be fixed by the librarian.
- f. **Library Timings and Instructions:**
 1. The Library is kept open from 8.00 a.m. to 6.00 p.m. on all working days. Issue counter works from 9.00 a.m. to 4.30 p.m.
 2. The Library is open to all the college members. Non-members may be admitted to the library only with the permission of the Principal.

3. The staff members are entitled to borrow 4 books at a time for a period of one month and periodicals (back numbers only) for 3 days. Sub-lending is forbidden.
4. The P.G. Students shall be allowed to borrow 4 books at a time for a period of 15 days. The degree and intermediate students may borrow 2 books at a time for a week. If however a book is in great demand the number of days may be reduced.
5. Books must be borrowed and returned in person. On borrowing a book, it should be examined at once and the Issue Assistants attention should be called to any defect therein. Every member borrowing a book from the library shall be responsible for its safe custody until its return and in the event of any loss or damages shall either replace the book at her own cost or pay such compensation as may be fixed by the librarian. If a volume belonging to a set is lost the reader may be asked to replace the whole set.
6. Borrowers failing to return books within the prescribed period shall pay a fine of 50 paisa per volume per day. If the due date happens to be a Sunday or a holiday, books shall be returned on the working day without fine.
7. No member shall be allowed to bring her books, printed matter or periodicals inside the library without the Librarian's permission. All library users should pass through the counter to check all books borrowed before they leave the library.
8. STRICT SILENCE IS TO BE MAINTAINED IN AND AROUND THE LIBRARY.
9. Special and Quick Reference Books cannot be taken outside the library.

10. All students must return their library tickets at least 15 days before examinations. In case of students who fail to settle their Library dues shall be dealt accordingly.
 11. Loss of library Ticket or Identity Cards should be reported to the Librarian who after investigation may issue duplicate tickets after obtaining a written undertaking from the borrower to the effect that she will be responsible for the books that are found to have been charged on her lost tickets.
 12. Original tickets found after the issue of duplicate should not be used but returned to the Library.
- g. Library Automation: Library is digitalized with LIBMAN Software System, Nagpur. Issue and return of books are done electronically using bar code system. Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC) System is installed and is connected to ten systems. Internet facility is available with Broad band connectivity of 1 Mbps
